My role as AD LTE is to drive developments in teaching and learning which enhance the student and staff experience. Much of this is focused on developments in e-learning. This report gives details of some of the developments.

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1. HEA accreditation

The university is committed to increasing the numbers of academic staff who have professional recognition by the HEA <https://www.heacademy.ac.uk/recognition-accreditation>, which is both advantageous to the staff professionally and collected as a KPI. While new academic staff are able to achieve D2 (Fellowship) via the MA in Higher Education Practice, established staff need a route through which to gain recognition. Over the next two years, The ADLTE and ADTP will work with CSED and Deans and Heads to identify staff who could go through the individual recognition route. This might include those who hold roles within the university which mean they are able to demonstrate the criteria, but doesn't exclude non-role holding staff. The aim to accredit a total of 100 staff to D2 (Fellow) D3 (Senior Fellow) and D4 (Principal Fellow) during the next year, and in 2017. The REAP programme previously approved by LTC is currently on hold.

2. E-marking

Significant progress is being made towards an efficient and user-friendly and sustainable approach to an all-electronic coursework process via Blackboard. I am pleased to announce that from AY16/17 all those wanting to use the this route will be able to do so, and this should be reported to LTS as module outlines are finalized.
