## Response to Freedom of Information Act 2000 request (FOI\_16-053)

*I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information from the University of East Anglia:*

*[Clarified on 17 February to limit the request to the NLA and CLA licences only]*

- *Did the University of East Anglia pay for a NLA (Newspaper Licensing Agency) or CLA (Copyright Licensing Agency) media license in 2013-2014?*

Yes, UEA paid for both a CLA and a NLA licence within the 2013-14 year.<sup>1</sup>

- *If so, how much was paid for the licenses in 2013-2014 (please provide the figures separately)?*

In 2013/14, UEA paid £145,705.06 for the CLA licence covering the period 01 August 2013 to 31 July 2014.

Also in 2013/14, UEA paid £6,339.79 for the NLA licence covering the period 01 August 2013 to 31 July 2014.<sup>2</sup>

- *Did the University of East Anglia pay for other media licenses (similar to the NLA or CLA) in 2013-2014? Please list any other media licenses that were subscribed to and how much was paid for them in 2013-2014.*

Not applicable – question withdrawn on 17 February 2016.

<sup>1</sup> We are defining '2013-14' as the University academic and financial year of 01 August 2013 to 31 July 2014.

<sup>2</sup> Please note that the term of the NLA licence is not equivalent to the UEA academic and financial year of August to July. The NLA licences runs from early May to early May and therefore the figures for the NLA represent a pro rata calculation from 2 separate invoices based on the period of August 2013 to April 2014, and May to July 2014. The period of August 2013 to April 2014 was actually invoiced and paid for in 2012-13.
