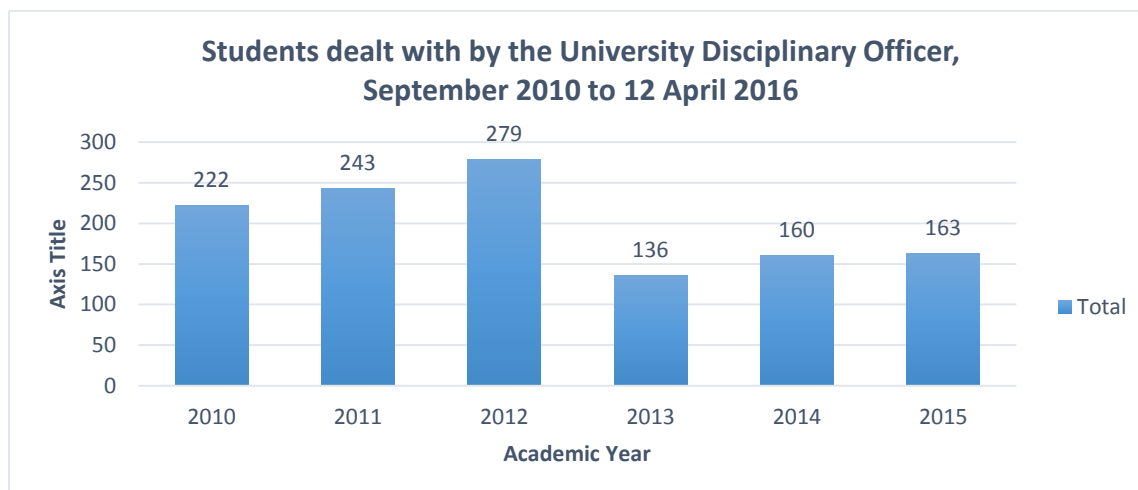


## Report on Non-Academic Student Disciplinary Cases, Student Experience Committee, April 2016

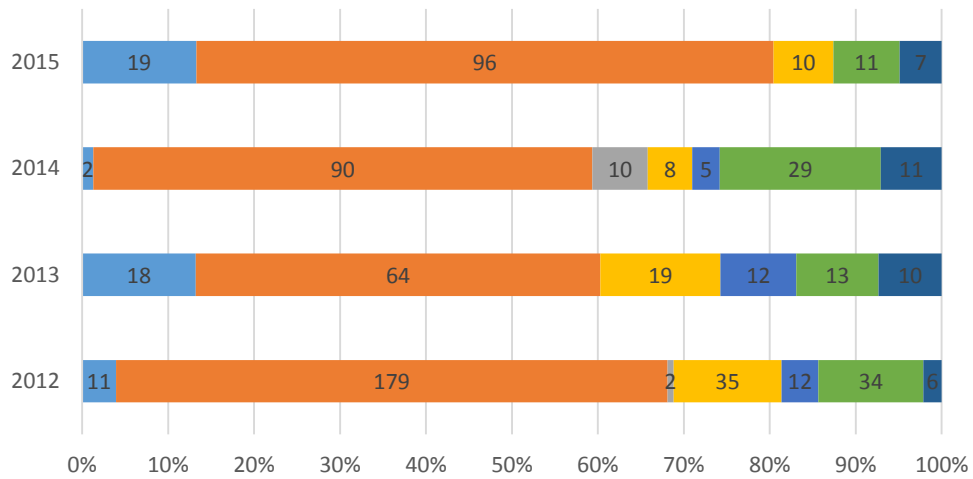


**Comment:** The Disciplinary Officer has dealt with more students so far this year than in the whole of last year. In 2013 and 2014 the Disciplinary Officer had dealt with approximately 60% of referrals by April; assuming similar trend this year, the projection for 2015 would be approximately 266.

\* The bullying/harassment figures presented here are not an accurate reflection of the number of students who have been reported to DOS and investigated under the University harassment procedures. Most victims of harassment, sexual violence or domestic abuse choose not to pursue the matter through to a formal disciplinary referral, therefore most perpetrators are not dealt with by the Disciplinary Officer. DOS appointment data is therefore more accurate in that regard.

**Comment:** The percentage of students who were dealt with in 2013 and 2014 by way of a fine remained consistent at approximately 40%.
