## Response to Freedom of Information Act 2000 request (FOI\_17-026)

*'I request the total sum of students you have currently studying International Development related courses, at postgraduate level (these are the courses used to calculate your position on the QS World University Rankings by subject 2016 – 'Development Studies'). I request the number of those studying online via distance education. I also request these numbers broken down by country'.*

Clarification received on 03 February:

*'Please would you be kind enough to send me information for just the taught postgraduate numbers? Country of domicile is all I need too'*

There are currently 172 taught postgraduate students currently studying International Development related courses.

We have provided a breakdown of these students' country of domicile below. Please note, for countries with fewer than five students, we have obscured the exact number. This is to avoid inadvertently disclosing personal data about individual students, either in this response or in combination with other publicly available information.

The School of International Development does not currently offer any online courses, therefore there are no taught postgraduate students formally studying International Development related courses via online distance education.

The University does offer a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) on Environmental Justice via Futurelearn; however, the course does not count towards the School's position on the QS World University Rankings by subject 2016 – 'Development Studies'. Let us know if you require information about this MOOC.
