We have now considered your request of 23 March 2017 for additional information to that provided in our response to your previous request (ref. [FOI_17-052](#))¹ as follows:

1. *How many students took at least one exam in the last four academic years, broken down by year?*
2. *How many students were caught cheating in any exam in the last four academic years, broken down by year (and subject if possible)?*
3. *How many students were caught cheating using smart watches in the last four academic years, broken down by year?*
4. *How many students were caught cheating using other technologies, such as mobile phones, over the last four academic years, broken down by year?*
5. *How many students were caught cheating using a hidden ear piece during the last four academic years, broken down by year?*
6. *How many students were caught cheating using a miniature camera during the last four academic years, broken down by year?*
7. *How many students were expelled or faced other disciplinary action because of cheating during the last four academic years, broken down by year?*
8. *Please can you provide the details of why these student were expelled over the last four academic years (no names)*

Our response is within the accompanying Excel file Appendix A_FOI_17-083. The data for 2012/13 has been added to the original data provided in response to your previous request. Please note that, in relation to question 8, we are providing figures
