## Response to Freedom of Information Act 2000 request (FOI\_17-251)

*I would like to receive a copy of the score grid used to rank applicants for 2018 entry together with the cutoff and average score for 2017 entry.*

The 2018 scoring sheet is provided in the accompanying PDF entitled FOI\_17-251 Appendix A.

The 2017 cut off score was 22 and the average score was 26.

*In addition, I would also like to know how you specifically score the UKCAT, and how points are allocated for total score and the SJT.*

UKCAT elements are scored using the following score based system:

- The UKCAT elements used are Quantitative Reasoning, Verbal Reasoning and Abstract. These 3 elements are each scored out of 900.
- The Situational Judgment Test is not used. The Decision Analysis was excluded in 2017, but will be used in 2018.
- The academic and UKCAT score are added together and the total score is used to rank applicants for interview.
- The weighting for academic score and UKCAT score is 67% academic and 33% UKCAT.
- A tabular representation of the ranking of scores is below:
