**Title:** Individual Exam Feedback Pilots

This paper sets out details of the pilots which will take place this Summer following the main series of Exams. The pilots cover three modules in three Faculties, with each one operating in a different way. An evaluation following the pilots will ascertain which of the pilots was most successful and the resources that would be required to scale the operation up, if this is a recommendation of the evaluation.

A meeting of nominated module organisers was held on 17 January, and the recommendations are reported below.

## Discussion

1. The modules involved and proposed method of feedback are:

3. The students currently on the PPL and ECO modules will be written to by LTS with the following statement:  
 "The University is currently piloting the return of examination scripts to students if they would like to see them. The return will take a different format depending upon the particular module and you will be informed of the precise details by your Module Organiser. The results of the various pilots will be evaluated by the University to inform further developments".
4. The PPL and ECO Module Organisers will then get in touch with the students to inform them of the precise details copying in their LTS team. The LTS team can send out the information on behalf of the Module Organiser if that's helpful.
5. The PPL and ECO Module Organisers will inform the markers on their modules to ensure they are aware of the arrangements.
6. The PPL and ECO Module Organisers will liaise with their LTS team to ensure that they have all the necessary information to give the feedback and scripts to students who ask, according to the table above.
7. The ENV module students will not be informed in advance intentionally, as part of the different methods of giving feedback; they will find the information on their Exam Feedback Blackboard site as detailed above.
8. The HSC module is a suggestion at this stage, and further discussions are required with the School, as the Module Organiser was not represented at the meeting. The School is keen to be involved, but we need to check that the timing will work for them.
9. After the process has been completed, Module Organisers will assess the effectiveness from students' and academics' viewpoints, and LTS will feed in their comments, and report back to LTC early in Autumn 2017 to inform further developments.
