1. EUROPEAN SOCIETY OF REGIONAL ANAESTHESIA (ESRA) PRIZE FOR ACHIEVEMENT

The ESRA Prize will be awarded to the outgoing student who achieves the highest aggregate mark in the MSc in Regional Anaesthesia.

Rules

1. There shall be a prize awarded annually by Norwich Medical School to be known as 'The ESRA Prize for Achievement – best outgoing student'.
2. The Prize shall be awarded to the Masters student in Norwich Medical School who achieves the highest aggregate mark in the MSc in Regional Anaesthesia.
3. The first year the Prize shall be awarded is 2016/17.
4. The Prize shall run for five years.
5. The Prize shall be a boxed medal or engraved plaque¹ awarded to the recipient to keep permanently.
6. It shall be awarded by the Head of School, on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners for the MSc in Regional Anaesthesia.
7. If two or more students have the same aggregate mark, the Board of Examiners will review the level of clinical experience of those students, as demonstrated in the student log book (MED-7041F), and may either award the prize to the student with the greater experience or share the prize.
8. If the highest aggregate mark were to be less than 60 the Board of Examiners will not award the prize in that year.
9. ESRA will issue the student with a complementary pass to the next Annual ESRA Congress in whichever country this is held, and provide an allowance of 300 EUR for personal expenses.
10. The recipient of the Prize will be asked to write a letter of thanks to the Sponsor and credit their support in any Continuing Professional Development portfolio.
11. Acceptance of the Prize is subject to allowing the University of East Anglia to publicise as appropriate the success of the candidate.

¹ University of East Anglia Finance Department will invoice the Sponsor for the production cost of the plaque.

2. MRES IN SOCIAL SCIENCE RESEARCH PRIZE FOR ACHEIVEMENT

An annual prize of £50 is awarded to the three students in the School of Psychology who achieve the highest aggregate mark in the MRes in Social Science Research.

Rules

1. There shall be three prizes awarded annually by the School of Psychology, each to be known as the MRes in Social Science Research Prize for Academic Achievement.
2. The Prize shall be awarded to the MRes SSRM students in the School of Psychology who achieve the highest three aggregate marks (65% and above- see point 5 below) across the whole taught programme and dissertation.
3. The value of the Prize shall be £50 per student.
4. It shall be awarded by the Board of the School of Psychology on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners.
5. If more than three candidates achieve the highest/same aggregate marks and are judged to be of sufficient and equal merit, the Prize may be divided. If no candidates are judged to be of sufficient merit (below 65% on aggregate), the Prize shall not be awarded.

3. MSc IN PSYCHOLOGY PRIZE FOR ACHIEVEMENT

An annual prize of £50 is awarded to each of the students in the School of Psychology who achieve the highest aggregate mark in each of the following degrees:

- MSc in Social Psychology
- MSc in Developmental Psychology
- MSc in Cognitive Neuroscience

Rules

There shall be three prizes awarded annually by the School of Psychology, one for each of the above degrees to be known as the MSc in Social Psychology/MSc in Developmental Psychology/MSc in Cognitive Neuroscience Prize for Academic Achievement.

1. The Prize shall be awarded to the Masters student in the School of Psychology who achieve the highest aggregate marks (65% and above) across the whole taught programme and dissertation.
2. The value of the Prize shall be £50 per student.
3. It shall be awarded by the Board of the School of Psychology on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners.
4. If two or more candidates achieve the highest/same aggregate marks and are judged to be of sufficient and equal merit, the Prize may be divided. If no candidates are judged to be of sufficient merit (below 65% on aggregate), the Prize shall not be awarded.

4. NBS SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITON

Terms and Conditions:

IMPORTANT: You must [apply online](#) to UEA, in addition to completing the Squire.com challenge, in order to win the 50% scholarship or one of the five £1000 fee waivers.

Prize: The winner of the competition will receive 50% fees scholarship, which equates to the value of £9,750. Five runners up will win £1000 fee waiver.

General Eligibility:

- In order to win you must have First or second class honours degree, or international equivalent, or Relevant postgraduate diploma, or; Qualification from a professional body recognised by UEA.
- You must have a minimum of five years' experience in a managerial, professional, or entrepreneurial role.
- International applicants need IELTS 6.5 (with a minimum score of 6.0 in all components: reading, writing, speaking and listening), or; Pearsons Test of English (PTE), Minimum score of 62 with no less than 55 in each component.
- You must be available for a Skype interview (dates and times will be agreed with applicant).
- Applicants must be accepted to UEA in order to win the fee waiver.
- The winner must be eligible to start in January 2018.
- The opportunity to win the scholarship is only available during the competition start and end date, 3rd August until 15th October 2017.

Further information:

- The 50% scholarship will be deducted from your course fees at the start of your year of study. If you fail to meet the standard for the award in any quarter, you will be sent an invoice for the amount owed.
- The £1000 waiver will be taken from the fees at the beginning of the course.
- If attendance is below 80% the scholarship will no longer be funded.
- UEA may want to document the winning applicant's year as an MBA student for marketing purposes.
- Living expenses and travel costs will need to be funded by the winner.
- The fee waiver is non-transferable and cannot be exchanged for cash or any other prize.
- All information submitted by the applicant must be truthful.
- Any work submitted by the applicant must be their own original work.
- The winners will be selected by UEA's MBA admissions team and will be based on the application to the competition and interview.
