

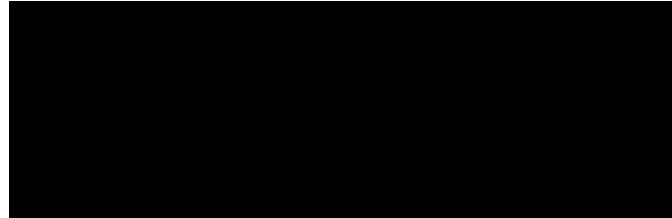

## Response to Freedom of Information Act 2000 request (FOI\_18-111)

1. *How many disciplinaries have you had around Class B Cannabis use? Please include the last 3 academic years including this one; 2015/16, 2016/17, 2017/to date*

Our response for the previous 3 academic years is provided in the table below:

Academic Year	Number of disciplinary actions
2015/16	5
2016/17	11
2017/18	7

During the current 2017/18 academic year, the University has implemented a tiered system for managing misconduct such as this, comprising of Disciplinary Officer referrals and misconduct warnings. The warnings are not a formal disciplinary action but may be used as evidence in subsequent Disciplinary Officer referrals for repeated or persistent behaviour. For 2017/18 there have been 6 misconduct warnings in addition to the 7 disciplinary cases listed above.

2. *How many of these disciplinaries have resulted in exclusion from Halls?; 2015/16, 2016/17, 2017/to date*

No students have been excluded from Halls of Residences since the 2015/16 academic year as a result of cannabis use.

3. *How many student/bed-spaces do you have available in your Halls?*

The University has 4478 rooms within our Halls of Residences.

4. *What is the normal/average response to personal Cannabis use in Halls?*

Typically, a financial penalty has been applied for students found to be smoking cannabis in residences, this is accompanied by a written warning.

5. *Please could you include a copy of your institutional Drugs Policy*

The University does not have a specific 'Drugs Policy' as these types of incidents are managed under the General Regulations for Students<sup>1</sup> and Terms and Conditions of the Licence to Occupy Residential Premises<sup>2</sup>.
