**Response to Freedom of Information Act 2000 request (FOI\_18-189)**

*1. How many people graduated from the University with the degree of Bachelor of Laws in July 2018?*

171 individuals were on a pass list between 01/07/2018 & 31/07/2018.

*2. How many of the people referred to in (1) above were awarded First Class Honours?*

20 graduates received a first class honours.

*3. How many of the people referred to in (1) above achieved a Grade Point Average score in excess of 4.0?*

3 graduates achieved a Grade Point Average above or equal to 4.0.

*4. How many of the people referred to in (1) above achieved a weighted average mark for classification purposes in excess of 70.95%?*

2 graduates had a classification mark greater than or equal to 70.95%.
