### **The Prize for the best overall grade in Geography**

1. This annual Prize is awarded for the best overall end of degree grade and is open to graduation year students registered in any of the following courses in the School of ENV:
  - BA Geography
  - BSc Geography
  - BA Geography with a Year in Industry
  - BSc Geography with a Year in Industry
2. The value of the Prize will be £100
3. The Prize will be awarded for the best overall grade.
4. The Prize will be awarded by a senior member of staff on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners.
5. If there are two candidates judged to be of the same merit, the Prize may be doubled so both students win £100 each, if there are more than 2 winners the school will divide a maximum of £250 by the total number of winners.
6. There is a fund donated by an anonymous donor, from which the annual awards of £100 will be made. The School should administer the prize by issuing a claim form to the winning student/s who claim the prize money from the School that administers their course.
7. The School will advise the Development Office who has won and which code needs to be reimbursed, the Development Office will then reimburse the school.

### **The Sir Roy & Lady Catherine Goode Prize for Best Overall Performance in the Degree of Master of Laws (updated January 2018)**

For a number of years Sir Roy and Lady Catherine Goode made generous donations to the School to support student prizes. The School is delighted that they have offered to do so again.

#### **Rules**

1. There shall be a Prize to be awarded annually in the School of Law to be known as the Sir Roy & Lady Catherine Goode Prize for Best Overall Performance in the Degree of Master of Laws.
2. The value of the Prize will be £1,500.
3. The Prize shall be awarded for the best overall performance in the Degree of Master of Laws.
4. The Prize shall be awarded by the Board of the School of Law on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners.
5. If in any year no candidate is judged to be of sufficient merit the Prize shall not be awarded; if two or more candidates are judged to be of equal merit the Prize may be divided.

### **The Sir Roy & Lady Catherine Goode Prize for Best Overall Performance in the Degree of Bachelor of Laws (updated Jan 2018)**

For a number of years Sir Roy and Lady Catherine Goode made generous donations to the School to support student prizes. The School is delighted that they have offered to do so again.

#### **Rules**

1. There shall be a Prize to be awarded annually in the School of Law to be known as the Sir Roy & Lady Catherine Goode Prize for Best Overall Performance in the Degree of Bachelor of Laws.
2. The value of the Prize will be £1,500.
3. The Prize shall be awarded for the best overall performance in the Degree of Bachelor of Laws.
4. The Prize shall be awarded by the Board of the School of Law on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners.
5. If two or more candidates are judged to be of equal merit the Prize may be divided.

#### **LDC Innovation in Assessment Prize**

This annual prize, worth £100, is awarded to the final year student producing a summative assessment deemed by the Teaching Committee to show the most innovation and creativity.

#### **Rules**

- i) There shall be a prize to be awarded annually to be known as the Innovation in Assessment Prize.
- ii) The value of the prize will be £100
- iii) The prize will be awarded to an LDC undergraduate final year student.
- iv) The prize will be judged by Teaching Committee, rewarding a summative assessment deemed to demonstrate most innovation and creativity (including creative-critical work).
- v) If no work is considered sufficiently innovative or creative the Teaching Committee reserves the right not to make an award; if two or more candidates are judged to have produced work of equal merit the prize may be divided.
