**Background**

The working group's aim this year was to showcase excellence an innovation in teaching practice at UEA, to include as much content as possible and to reflect the diversity of approaches to teaching, and to provide a networking opportunity for colleagues from across the disciplines.

The day was designed to reflect the breadth of innovative teaching practice at UEA and thus the focus for submissions was left 'open': participants were asked to submit either a short paper or an interactive display of teaching practice they felt to be particularly creative, effective and

likely to be of interest to colleagues. The main change from previous years was the format of the day – largely the introduction of the exhibits (in place of posters) which were curated in the TSPC foyer. Notable exhibits included demonstrations of virtual reality goggles (from Chemistry), a suit which simulated old age (Health) and the *pets as therapy* reading dogs, who joined us for lunch. The keynote was Ian Turner (Head of Forensic Science, University of Derby) who gave an engaging talk on the uses of *gamification* in teaching.

The number of attendees was down slightly on previous years – 153 as compared to 176 in 2017 – however, feedback was very good, with the majority of respondents indicating that they very much liked the new format and hoped it would be repeated next year. A full report of attendance statistics and participant feedback is attached.

Proposed actions for next year, based on this feedback, are:

- Retain the 'show and tell' format
- Keep the focus on practical innovation in teaching and learning
- Consider how the day is marketed to colleagues to maximise attendance
- Review timings (coffee, turnaround between sessions)
- Expand the number of exhibits and short talks

The next Learning and Teaching Day will take place on **THURSDAY 23 MAY 2019**











## TOTAL ATTENDEES

Novel MCQ marking technique; interesting approaches to obtaining higher student involvement (post-its); using actors to test 'scenarios' for certain roles.

Also; apparently, the idea that economic theories can be discredited based on the author's gender and ethnicity (See; 'White men' who are automatically wrong...)

How Blackboard's functionality can be improved. That gamification really IS powerful (but still I don't know how I can use it well for my teaching in Management)

It was great seeing the ideas and energy around teaching at UEA. The main thing I'll be taking back is inspiration!

Some possible uses of technology.

Several ideas for new activities in the classroom. I like the philosophy behind gaming for learning.

The use of gamification can be adapted by subject.

Some more ideas about gamification

Primarily, new methods to support student learning and develop engagement.

Simple way to get to know my students. possible use of games in my teaching.

A useful method for gathering data on students' levels of confidence and self awareness about their own levels of knowledge and understanding (but using a different method of multiple choice quiz).

Ideas for making sessions more inclusive as well as ideas for increasing engagement.

Use of technology in teaching

Range of things including creative ways to engage and acknowledge students as individuals

New ways of thinking about how students learn. Dr Ian Turner's presentation was very thought provoking and I liked the idea of using gaming mechanics to promote behavioural change - I believe this could be used to really engage and challenge students. I also found the sessions I attended very helpful - and met a new contact so thank you!

## What would you like to see at next year's Learning & Teaching Day?

Hear more from academics from outside UEA re. blended learning
