

**Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Information request (ref: FOI\_19-319)**

We have now considered your request of 01 October 2019 for information relating to average marks achieved for History and any History joint subjects, and Law and Law-related undergraduate courses in 2018-19.

## **Freedom of Information Act 2000 request (FOI\_19-319)**

*'I am writing to request information on the following undergraduate programmes provided by the University:*

- 1. Any law or law-related degree (e.g. law and business, law and sociology)*
- 2. History and History joint subjects (e.g. history and politics)*

*For each of these courses, what is:*

- a) The average mark, over each degree course, attained in each first year module in the academic year 2018/2019?*
- b) The average mark, over each degree course, attained in each second year module in the academic year 2018/19?*
- c) The average mark, over each degree course, attained in each final year module in the academic year 2018/19?*
- d) The average overall mark, over each degree course, attained by students at the end of their first year of studies in the academic year 2018/2019?*
- e) The average overall mark, over each degree course, attained by students at the end of their second year of studies in the academic year 2018/2019?*
- f) The average overall mark, over each degree course, attained by students in their final year of studies in the academic year 2018/2019?*
- g) The average numerical mark, over each degree course, attained in the overall final degree in the academic year 2018/2019 (taking into account all exams and coursework that contribute to the final degree mark)? For example, an average of 64, rather than 2:1.*

*Please exclude those who failed to attend the examination and so may have been awarded a mark of zero.*

*To clarify, where I have written: 'over each degree course', I am requesting the average mark calculated for all students on each specific degree course. For instance, a History module may have students from both the History degree course and the History and Politics degree course, in which case, I am requesting an average mark for the module for those on the History course, and the average mark for those on the History and Politics course separately.*

*I understand that some data may not be stored at this level of specificity, especially in the case of average module marks. If that is the case, please could we have the relevant overall average mark (e.g. the average for the module over all the students who sat the exam). If the data is only available in that form, it would be very helpful if you could add a quick note to say so.*

*I have attached a template which gives an example of the information I am requesting. I have tried to be as clear as possible, but please do let me know if there is any further clarification that you require.'*
