

Response to Freedom of Information Act 2000/ request (FOI_19-003)

1) How many people are currently studying at your university?

As of 09/01/2019 the total number of students studying at the University is 18,583.

We have included in this number students who are current, or 'provisional current', i.e. those yet to register. This is because at this time in the year there are students at UEA who have not yet registered.

It is important to point out that the 2018/19 data set is 'live'. The numbers have the potential to change on a daily basis, as new students start or current students withdraw from or complete their course.

2) How many of these are over 60? Could you please also break them down by age group if possible (60s, 70s, 80s, 90+)

A total of 116 students are aged over 60, broken down within the table below.
