Administrative history

A core collection of documents for public reference has been established in the University Library under the title The UEA Collection.

Catalogue records

Generally, the books, journals and individual recordings have been catalogued in the Library Catalogue, correspondence and papers have been catalogued in the Archives Union branch of the Library Catalogue.

Scope and content

The UEA Collection consists of 33 sub-collections or series of papers and audio-visual materials deposited by staff, alumni, and other persons associated with the University. (See **System of Arrangement** below).

Several of the series deal with the origins of the University, some others are composed of copies of documents made available to Dr Michael Sanderson, author of the official history of the University, UEA/SAN. Series UEA/TIL is of particular note, being the papers of Gordon Tilsley, the man most closely involved in the movement to establish a university in Norwich. There is a degree of duplication of content in these series. They are complementary to Series SZ/UEA in the Zuckerman Archive.

Series UEA/EDE and UEA/SCH consist of the memorabilia of former students.

Biographical note

Sir Malcolm Bradbury (1932-2000) was Professor at UEA's former School of English and American Studies (EAS) from 1970-1994.

Institutional Biographical note

In August 2004 the former EAS was dissolved and three new schools came into existence: Literature and Creative Writing (LIT); Film and Television Studies (FTV); and American Studies (AMS).

Provenance

Files UEA/BRAD/1-27 were picked up by Alex Noel-Tod (former UEA Subject Librarian) from the Norwich home of the late Malcolm Bradbury in 2005. They were catalogued and became part of the UEA Archive collection in 2006.

Files UEA/BRAD/28-41 form part of a separate deposit (December 2013) made by Dominic Bradbury (Malcolm Bradbury's son).

Scope and content

Files UEA/BRAD/1-27 contain papers collected by Bradbury during his Professorship at (EAS). It contains correspondence, course administrative papers, course work and notes, and papers relating to examinations held at this and other universities.

Files UEA/BRAD/28-41 span all of Bradbury's writing career and include film, radio and television scripts, journal offprints, printed lectures/essays, press cuttings, book jackets, biographical sketches and interviews.

Related Collections

Papers relating to the MA Creative Writing course led by Bradbury between 1992 and 1995 are referenced as LIT/CW.

Roy H. Campbell was Professor of Economics and Pro-Vice-Chancellor of the University of East Anglia from 196- until 1971.

Scope and content

This series consists of papers relating to Prof. Campbell's activities as Pro-Vice-Chancellor of the University of East Anglia and includes correspondence concerning his resignation from that and his other university offices (his professorship excepted) in November 1970. The resignation was deferred to the end of the academic year 1970-1971 and did not in fact take effect, since Prof. Campbell took up an appointment at the University of Stirling in academic year 1971-1972.

The files deal in particular with three contentious issues that affected the University during this its early years: student discipline; trade union recognition and industrial action by staff; and relations with Denys Lasdun & Partners.

Provenance

The files are as received by hand of Dr Michael Sanderson, historian of UEA, on June 10th 2002. Dr Sanderson had received them from Prof. Campbell with authorisation to dispose of them as he thought fit.

Includes two MS notes [by Prof. Campbell, 2002?] on the question of whether or not the file should be retained. Contains correspondence relating to the decision of UEA's Council to accede to student demands for an additional bank account to be opened with a bank other than Barclays, the University's bankers, for handling payments made by students who had ethical objections to Barclays' business activities in South Africa. A lay member of Council, Lord Cranbrook, resigned over the decision, and Prof. Campbell followed suit. Many of the letters in the file express support for Prof. Campbell.

UEA/CAM/2 Car Parking, 1970

Correspondence and memoranda relating to question of providing adequate staff car parking space, and measures to raise funds to provide car parking, in particular proposals to levy parking charges. Parking charges were vociferously opposed by UEA staff and the file includes correspondence relating to this and in particular the legal position regarding strike action by academics.

UEA/CAM/3 Notes on Meetings re Buildings, 1967-1969

This file is complementary to File UEA/CAM/4, and copies of some documents are to be found in both files. Includes references to buildings planned but not constructed, such as the Mackintosh Hall, the long-term capacity of the existing site to accommodate growth, and liability for the failure of the lining of a boiler-house chimney.

UEA/CAM/4 Denys Lasdun & Partners, 1967-1968

Contents chiefly as for File UEA/CAM/3, but also includes some papers relating to the Committee on the Relationship with the Architect, the Site Committee, and related bodies.

Although the title refers to only one trade union, the Association of Scientific, Technical, and Managerial Staffs, the file covers the question of trade union recognition and employer-staff negotiation more generally. Includes a copy of the draft report of the Working Party on Negotiating and Consultative Machinery [1970]. The matter of industrial action by staff is also referred to in other files, notably UEA/CAM/2.

Contains MS speaking notes and a typescript draft, headed "Student Welfare and Discipline", of an address [by Prof. Campbell] to Norwich magistrates, 23rd October 1970, appended to which is a typescript, "The 10 points of the N.U.S.", c. January 1969.

The file contains two items of correspondence from July 1971 between Prof. Campbell and Mr Timothy Colman relating to the role of university professors in the administration and management of a university.

The rest of the contents relate to the reports of the Commission of Inquiry into the Code of Discipline and the General Regulations, October 1971, and of the Working Party on the Use of Drugs, March 1971. By the time the Commission reported, Prof. Campbell had departed UEA for the University of Stirling. Included is a typescript copy of a paper "The Office of the Dean of Students", 13th June 1967, signed by N. Brooke, R.H. Campbell, G.D. Garton, and J.A. Jackson, arguing against the appointment of a full-time successor to the Dean of Students of the day and instead for the Dean of Students to be an academic and appointed part-time on a rotating basis.

Provenance: This collection which now forms a sub-collection of the UEA Collection was gifted by RSG to UEA and was deposited in the Archives in February 2013.

Biographical description: Richard S. Grayson (1969-) was a student at UEA in English and American Studies (EAS) from 1987-91. In 1989-90 he held the post of sabbatical General Secretary of the Students' Union. The role replaced the previous 'President' for a few years until the current flat structure was brought in.

Following UEA, RSG obtained a Doctorate of Philosophy in Modern History at Queen's College, Oxford.

During subsequent years RSG was involved in the Liberal Democrats at a number of levels.

In 1999-2004 he was the party's Director of Policy, coordinating the writing of the party's 2001 general election manifesto. In 1999-2001 he was also Charles Kennedy's principal speechwriter. He was the party's parliamentary candidate for Hemel Hempstead constituency in the 2005 and 2010 general elections.

RSG took up an academic post at Goldsmiths, University of London, in 2004.

After 25 years in the Liberal Democrat Party, RSG effectively withdrew his membership on 30/6/13.

Other topics include prices in SU outlets, the sale of scarves, a meeting to discuss the salary of the SUS General Manager, safety regulations regarding the walls along Norfolk and Suffolk

Terrace walkways, bus services, staff donations to Rag charities, SU representation at the V-C's welcoming address, the allocation of a room to mature students in Union House, SU Trustees, the relationship between ENTS and the SUS Bars, housing benefits, assistance to a Students' Union in Czechoslovakia, and resignations and appointments of SU Officers.

Biographical History

Willi (Wilhelm Leo) Guttsman (23/08/1920-13/02/1998) was the author of a number of important scholarly works on German history, particularly on the German Social Democratic party in the Imperial and Weimar periods and its views on, and experience of, art and culture. He was also the founding Librarian at the UEA (1962-1985).

Provenance

Towards the end of 2004 Alex Noel-Tod (Subject Librarian) arranged a deposit of a donation of books from Guttsman's Library. These nine items would be added to Special Collections along with a pamphlet box of off-prints of journal articles, reviews, notices, etc.

A small collection of manuscripts, correspondence, and photographs, formed the basis of archive series UEA/GUT within the UEA collection.

An additional deposit of files was made to this collection in 2012. This originated from the UEA Information Services Directorate Office.

KESWICK HALL COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, 1969-1973, 1981

Administrative/Biographical History

Norwich Teacher Training College (later Keswick Hall College of Education) opened in 1839, in Cathedral Close, in the city of Norwich.

For the first century and a quarter the college was for women only. In 1892 it moved to new buildings situated in the central area of Norwich, where it remained until just after the Second World War.

In 1942 the college was bombed in the raids during the 1939-45 war. The college continued in temporary accommodation and in 1948 moved to Keswick Hall, a Regency building offered by the Gurney family of Norwich. From that time until 1984, the hall was used for teacher training.

The present School of Education and Professional Development is situated on the main University of East Anglia campus. Keswick Hall itself is now occupied by a variety of commercial companies - the student hostels being converted into private residential accommodation.

Scope and content

Contains plans and miscellaneous papers on Keswick Hall. Papers on Keswick Hall can also be found elsewhere in the UEA Collection, including UEA/JONES/38.

Provenance

The plans were found in a Main UEA Library storeroom in 01/06. Other material originated from Keswick Hall Library and UEA Library, and were acquired through various deposits.

Contains about 72 plans of Keswick Hall Library, 1981. The plans were found in a storeroom of the Main UEA Library in 01/06. A full listing accompanies the plans. They were commissioned by UEA Design and Projects Section, Registry.

The plans are of the remodelled (but never built) KH Library. They are evidence of the original intention in the early 80s (following the incorporation of KH College into UEA as the School of Education) to keep Education at KH and to use the buildings and the library for the new school of Law (at that time in rather crowded accommodation in the Arts building). A lot of time and effort was put in to planning to rebuild the library at KH as an Education/Law Library. In the end funding was secured to build a new School of Education on campus, and KH was sold for private development.

The plans were offered to UEA Estates but since KH is no longer owned by UEA, they declined to keep them.

Viscount Mackintosh of Halifax chaired the Promotion Committee, a broad-based group established in 1958, the task of which was to campaign for the establishment of a new university in East Anglia. Mackintosh was temperamentally well suited to the role and spoke widely in support of the project. On the granting of the University's charter, Mackintosh was appointed Chancellor-Designate; sadly, he died on 27th December 1964, five months before he was due to be formally installed.

Scope and content

The contents consist of digital copies of two monochrome photographic prints of the presentation to Lord Mackintosh of the University Mace by Mr Gomm on behalf of the Norwich Junior Chamber of Commerce, May 1964, and microfilm copies of 10 sets of speaking notes, 1960-1964. The events at which Lord Mackintosh spoke include receptions in Norwich and Ipswich; the first meeting of the University Court, 18 April 1964; and the opening of the Senior Common Room, 13 November 1964.

Biographical note

Nexus Television was established in 1969, at the suggestion of the Director of the Audio-Visual Centre, Malcolm Freegard, in an attempt to channel some of the students' enthusiasm for television and film making in a useful direction. In the beginning Nexus had an output of one weekly programme, recorded in the Audio Visual Centre and shown in an Arts Block Common Room.

In the early seventies Nexus moved to University House where it operated until its closure in 1989.

Nexus won the News and Current Affairs award for its coverage of Prince Charles' visit to UEA as part of its 25th anniversary celebrations. The award was presented at the 21st conference of the National Students' Television Association. In spite of this, the television network, which launched the career of Selina Scott, was closed in 1989. It was reported that the output was boring to most students.

Also includes correspondence relating to the move of the Fisher Theatre collection within the Library.

Part 2

Concerns a new bid (resubmission) from the County Council to the HLF. This bid was successful.

Papers relating to the new proposals of re-housing EAFA with a new Record Office at County Hall are included, also substantial papers relating to EAFA, including correspondence, trust proposals, articles of association, a business plan for 2000-2005, and one set of photographs which have also been copied to slides.

He married Helen Kindon at the beginning of his final year and they lived in a flat at 64 Lilian Close, Norwich, NOR 82 N (1965/66). Adrian had his own printing press hence the freely available headed notepaper. He also printed programmes, tickets and invitations for the University and for fellow students, some have been included in this deposit. He was a member of the Film Club, a member of the Labour Club, and a member of the Students' Council. Helen was Secretary of the Students' Council (1965/66).

The letters cover the social and cultural life at UEA and in Norwich, this includes film, theatre and music; Adrian's courses, lectures, reading, field work and studies; the activities of fellow students and friends; Adrian's involvement as a member of the Students' Council; residential experiences; financial figures, grants and financial arrangements; wedding arrangements; setting up home as newly-weds; job hunting and post university prospects. The final letter in this collection is written on 11/8/66 as Adrian and Helen are just about to leave Norwich for Aberystwyth, he did not have a job lined up.

Administrative/Biographical History

The Students' Union at UEA was formed shortly after the first students arrived, in October 1963. At an inaugural meeting, held on 13 October 1963, a temporary committee of seven members was elected. This committee then made arrangements for the election of a governing body for a students' union in the form of a Students' Council, to hold office for the first academic year.

All matriculated students automatically became members of the Students' Union. The Union was a formal link between the student body and the University authorities, representing student interests and organizing those activities which were beyond the scope of the usual range of societies and clubs.

In its early years, and notably the 1970s, the activities of the Union were strongly influenced by wider political issues, but by the end of the 1980s the focus shifted to the social life of students and student welfare. This was recognised in a revised constitution in 1989, when the name was changed to Union of UEA Students.

The present Union of UEA Students provides an extensive range of professional and well-established advice and support units, it also runs many of the commercial enterprises on campus, such as the newsagent and post office, the food shop, bookshop, travel agent and the bars. The Union organises most of the entertainment on campus, from freshers' week to the end-of-term balls. It also funds a large number of sporting and non-sporting clubs and societies.

Scope and content

UEA/SU/1 Minutes and address, 1963-64

This file consists of a ring-binder containing minutes of the meeting of the Students' Union from 13 October 1963 to 30 June 1964 and the Vice-Chancellor's address to the matriculation ceremony held on 7th October 1963.

The contents of the sub-collection were originally held by successive officers of the Students' Union but in 1999 were found among a quantity of material due to be despatched as refuse by Richard Snelling, the first President of the Students' Union. He retained possession until June 2004 when he deposited the ring-binder, containing early meeting minutes, with the Archives Department of the University Library.

Gordon Tilsley was Town Clerk of Norwich during the period in which UEA was established. He served as Secretary to the various groups and committees concerned with first promoting the case for the establishment of a new university, to be situated in East Anglia, and then setting up the new institution.

Scope and Content

The papers in this sub-collection are those retained by Gordon Tilsley after the formal establishment of UEA and both precede and complement the University records. Their present order has been determined largely by the use to which they were put when Mr Tilsley was preparing an account of the foundation of UEA at the request of Professor Jimmy Jones (the document in File UEA/TIL/11).

The files include minutes, memoranda, correspondence and MS notes.

In addition to the numbered files listed, there is a small quantity of loose papers, chiefly duplicates of items in the numbered files.
