Response to Freedom of Information Act 2000 request (FOI_14-148)

Please can I receive an up to date list of all the subcontractors, suppliers and consultants involved in Scheme comprises construction of the Norwich medical research building. The scheme must: 1) Provide a minimum of 826 sqm of teaching space; 2) Provide a minimum of 350 sqm of technical space; 3) Provide a minimum of 1,134 sqm of category 2 laboratory space; 4) Be located within 1 mile of the University's Norwich Campus and the Norfolk and Norwich University Hospital; 5) Offer easily accessible public transport facilities; 6) Set high standards of architectural design. Breeam Excellent standard is envisaged; 7) Be made available to the University via sale or long lease arrangement. The associated works include access roads, enabling, sewer systems, infrastructure and landscaping.
