Your request:

Can you please provide details of any payments that your institution has agreed to pay its vice-chancellor upon their retirement. These could include bonuses, ex-gratia lump sums termination payments or other form of emolument to mark the end of the vice-chancellor's end of office.

For clarity, I am not seeking any information on payments related to the USS, which is a private pensions – rather, I am interested in any supplementary arrangements that the university has put in place for its institutional head.
