

British Psychological Society Prize

1. There shall be a prize awarded annually under the auspices of the British Psychological Society (BPS), to be known as the British Psychological Society Prize.
2. The Prize shall be awarded to the final year candidate in the School of Social Work and Psychology completing an Honours degree in Psychology, with the highest aggregate in the 2nd and 3rd years of their degree programme.
3. The value of the prize shall be determined by the BPS, currently comprising a certificate, a copy of the Society's Book of the year and one year's free graduate membership of the Society.
4. It shall be awarded by the Board of the School on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners for the BSc in Psychology programme.
5. If in any year no candidate is judged suitable the prize shall not be awarded. If two or more eligible students gain equal highest overall aggregate in their programme, the prize will be awarded to the candidate who has attained the greater number of credits with first class marks, with particular weight being given to the 3rd year research project module.

The Association of Physicians of Great Britain and Ireland Prizes

1. There shall be up to five prizes awarded annually under the auspices of the Association of Physicians of Great Britain and Ireland, to be known as the Association of Physicians of Great Britain and Ireland Prizes, for the purpose of encouraging undergraduate research.
2. The Association of Physicians of Great Britain and Ireland Prizes shall be awarded in accordance with criteria to be published by the School of Medicine, Health Policy and Practice for performance in the final year undergraduate research project.
3. The value of each cash prize shall be £200 or a higher amount, to be equally divided, if fewer awards are made. The Prize-winners shall also be awarded a Certificate of Merit by the School of Medicine, Health Policy and Practice.
4. Up to five runners-up will each be awarded a Certificate of Merit by the School of Medicine, Health Policy and Practice for performance in the final year undergraduate research project in accordance with the published criteria.
5. The Prizes and Certificates of Merit shall be awarded by the Board of the School on the recommendation of members of the Research Projects Team in the School of Medicine, Health Policy and Practice.
6. If no candidate is judged to be of sufficient merit, the Prizes and/or Certificates of Merit shall not be awarded.

Additional document

The North Walsham Vikings Scholarship(s)

1. There shall be a Scholarship Programme to be known as the North Walsham Vikings Scholarship(s) to enable full-time undergraduate or postgraduate student(s) to study at the University of East Anglia whilst simultaneously playing for North Walsham Vikings RFC.
2. Students who have satisfied the academic requirements for admission to the University of East Anglia and who have the ability to play for the North Walsham Vikings RFC will be eligible to apply for the Scholarship(s). Current University of East Anglia students who have the ability to play for the North Walsham Vikings RFC will also be eligible to apply but the value of the Scholarship will be dependent on the number of years remaining of the student's course.
3. The Scholarship(s) shall contribute a minimum of £1,000 per annum (paid in up to three equal instalments, depending on the length of the course or of the number of years remaining of the student's course) to the recipient's full course fees up to a maximum of three years, subject to satisfactory progress. The maximum scholarship level shall be at the discretion of North Walsham Vikings RFC and will be assessed on an individual basis.
4. The Scholarship(s) shall be awarded on a competitive basis and will become payable on completion of registration of the successful applicant at the University of East Anglia.
5. The Scholarship(s) will be awarded by the Committee at North Walsham Rugby Vikings Football Club in order, firstly, that the required level of rugby excellence is evident in Scholarship recipients. Beyond this decision being reached, the Scholarship recipient(s) will need to secure a place at the University of East Anglia in the same way as any other applicant.
6. The Scholarship recipient(s) will be required to play, at weekends, for the North Walsham Vikings RFC, but will be permitted to play for UEARFC in BUCS fixtures during term time in order to benefit from the University Sport experience subject to the proviso that in the event of a timetable clash between a North Walsham Vikings or UEARFC event and a University event relating to the academic programme of study of a scholarship holder, the University event relating to the academic programme of study will take precedence.
7. North Walsham Vikings RFC will contribute to reasonable travel costs to ensure the Scholarship recipient(s) are able to get to training and matches.
8. If in any year there are no eligible candidates, the Scholarship(s) shall not be awarded.
9. The Scholarship(s) shall be conferred at a special event organised by North Walsham Rugby Club and the University of East Anglia.

The Mark V Williams Undergraduate Scholarship

1. There shall be a Scholarship to be known as the Mark V Williams Undergraduate Scholarship to enable an undergraduate student to study for a BSc (Hons) in Accounting and Finance. (If, in the future, the course is discontinued, UEA will ensure that the funds are diverted to the course with the most similar aims and objectives).
2. Students ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom who are eligible to pay fees at the Home/EU rate and who come from a household where the total household income is less than £25,000 in accordance with the documents provided to the LEA, will be eligible to apply for the Scholarship.
3. One new Scholarship will be available every three years. It shall contribute to the recipient's full course fees up to a maximum of three years, subject to satisfactory progress. This assumes that the fee costs remain at the levels set for September 2010 to include an inflationary increase at 2.04%. In a situation where course fees escalate above that level the Scholarship will become a part rather than a full award.
4. The scholarship shall be awarded on a competitive basis and will become payable on completion of registration of the successful applicant. It shall not be divided.
5. Details of the Mark V Williams Undergraduate Scholarship will be publicised to all eligible students with appropriate information on selection criteria, application timescales and value of award.
6. The Scholarship will be awarded by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of a Selection Committee comprising the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Associate Dean for Admissions in the Faculty of Social Sciences and the Head of the Norwich Business School.
7. If in any year there are no eligible candidates, the Scholarship shall not be awarded. It may be offered in a subsequent year.
8. Holders of a Mark Williams Undergraduate Scholarship will not be eligible to hold a Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship at the same time.
