Issue

Confirmation of Chair's Action taken on the following:

- (1) Approval of the Charles L Walker Scholarship
- (2) Concession to change the Bachelors and Integrated Masters Regulation 13.1 for 2013/14

(1) **Approval of the Charles L Walker Scholarship**

This scholarship was made possible through an endowment by the family of Colonel Charles L. Walker, former Liberator pilot of the USAAF, and member of the Second Air Division Memorial Trust (No Charity 269047)

1. The purpose of the Colonel Charles L. Walker Scholarship is to contribute to the costs of an undergraduate student's year abroad, to be spent in the USA at a recognised university. The Scholarship will be awarded to the highest performing undergraduate student from the School of American Studies at UEA.
2. Subject to available funds, the scholarship is to be awarded annually, to the student who achieves the highest mark based on overall academic performance prior to the year away, and will only be awarded to a student scoring a minimum of 60% overall.
3. The funds will be held in endowment by the Memorial Trust of the 2nd Air Division USAAF, the Governors of which will determine the number and value of scholarship(s) based on income derived from the funds endowed. The minimum value of the scholarship in any one year will be £3000, which the 2nd Air Division Memorial Library Trust will ensure and the fund will bear its own management costs.
4. On return to UEA at the end of the year in the USA, the student will produce a written report, submitted through the Development Office at UEA, detailing the achievements of their year and the benefits of the support received.
5. The recipient will not be allowed to hold any other UEA scholarship at the same time. If the recipient is successful in obtaining a form of award larger than the amount above, it is expected that their Scholarship will then be passed to a reserve candidate.

6. The recipient will be required to attend an event for publicity purposes and agrees, on acceptance, to the storage and publication by UEA of their name and personal image.
7. In the event that the recipient is unable to complete the year abroad, the recipient must immediately inform the Development Office at UEA. Should the recipient fail to complete their year abroad or withdraw they could be asked to repay the award in full: this will be judged on a case-by-case basis.

(2) **Concession to change the Bachelors and Integrated Masters Regulation 13.1 for 2013/14**

Concession to change the Bachelors and Integrated Masters Regulation 13.1 for 2013/14 **from** 'Students eligible for reassessment will be offered a reassessment opportunity in all failed components of the failed module, normally in the form of the original assessment. Any exceptions to this may be made only with the approval of the Learning and Teaching Committee of Senate' **to:**

Students eligible for reassessment will be offered a reassessment opportunity in all failed components of the failed module normally in the form of the original assessment, **except in the *following circumstance**. Any exceptions to this may be made only with the approval of the Learning and Teaching Committee of Senate.

***Where a student has failed both a course test and an exam assessment item in a failed module, the reassessment will be by exam, and the mark obtained for the exam will replace both the original course test mark and the original exam mark.**
