Confirmation of Chair's Action taken on the following:

- 1) The Savile Scholarship in MA Creative Entrepreneurship
- 2) The Paul Tucker Scholarship

1) **The Savile Scholarship in MA Creative Entrepreneurship**

This Scholarship is available for students wishing to study for the MA Creative Entrepreneurship at the University of East Anglia and will contribute to the recipient's full course fee for one year 2014/15.

1. The Scholarship will be known as The Savile Scholarship. The purpose of the Scholarship is to enable a student to study the MA Creative Entrepreneurship course offered by the Faculty of Arts and Humanities to be awarded to a full-time student on the MA in Creative Entrepreneurship course for 2014/15.
2. The Scholarship is open to Home/EU students and international students applying to study on the MA in Creative Entrepreneurship course for 2014/15.
3. The Scholarship shall contribute £5,000 to the recipient's full course fees at the home/EU or international rate for a 12 month period.
4. The Scholarship will be based on an assessment of the following:
 - a) The quality of the creative work submitted with the student's course application.
 - b) The originality and inventiveness of the student's personal statement.
5. The first Scholarship will be awarded in September 2014.
6. Details of the Savile Scholarship will be publicised to all eligible students with appropriate information on selection criteria (see below), application timescale and value of the award.
7. The Scholarship will be awarded by a Senior Member of Staff on the recommendation of a Selection Committee comprising of the Course Director MACE and Director of the Centre for Creative and Performing Arts.
8. In the event that there are two or more candidates who are deemed to be of equal merit, the Scholarship shall not be divided and the Selection Committee will decide

upon the winner based upon interviews with each candidate. The successful recipient's name and a short cv will be forwarded to the appropriate committee of the Savile Club for information.

2) **The Paul Tucker Scholarship**

1. There shall be a Scholarship to be known as the Paul Tucker Scholarship, which has been established to support an undergraduate student studying within one of the following Faculties: Science; Medicine and Health Sciences; or Social Sciences, at the University of East Anglia.
2. Students ordinarily resident in Wales who are eligible to pay fees at the Home/EU rate, who achieve AAA at A-level and who come from a household where the total household income is less than £25,000, in accordance with the documents provided to the SLC, will be eligible for the Scholarship.
3. One new Scholarship will be available per annum from the academic year 2014/15 to 2016/17. It shall contribute £5,500 to the recipient's course fees up to a maximum of three years, subject to satisfactory progress.
4. The Scholarship will be awarded by a senior member of staff on the recommendation of a Selection Committee comprising representatives from: the Faculty of Science, the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, the Faculty of Social Science, Admissions and/or Recruitment. The Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Academic) will be called upon to make a final decision if necessary.
5. The Scholarship shall be awarded on a competitive basis and will become payable on completion of registration of the successful applicant. It shall not be divided.
6. The Scholarship will be awarded to the candidate who receives the highest score for their application, based on the criteria below:
 - Outstanding academic achievement
7. If in any year there are no eligible candidates, the Scholarship shall not be awarded. It may be offered in a subsequent year.
8. Holders of the Paul Tucker Scholarship will not be eligible to hold any other scholarship at the same time.
9. The recipient will be required to attend an event for publicity purposes and agrees, on acceptance, to the storage and publication of their name and personal image by UEA. At the end of each academic year, for the duration of the scholarship, the recipient will produce a written report, submitted through the Development Office at UEA.
10. In the event that the recipient withdraws from or does not complete their degree, the recipient will be asked to repay the award in full.
