Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Information request (ref: FOI_15-066)

We have now considered your request of 30 March 2015 for the following information:

‘...how many students applied to the courses at your university and then subsequently graduated for the academic years 09/10, 10/11, 11/12, 12/13, 13/14 with the following school subjects.

English Qualifications: GCSE Accounting; GCSE Business Studies; GCSE Economics; AS-Level Accounting; AS-Level Business Studies; AS-Level Economics; A-Level Accounting; A-Level Business Studies; A-Level Economics

Scottish Qualifications: Standard Grade Accounting; Standard Grade Administration and ICT; Standard Grade Business Management; Standard Grade Economics; Intermediate Level Accounting; Intermediate Level Administration and ICT; Intermediate Level Business Management; Intermediate Level Economics; Higher Accounting; Higher Administration and ICT; Higher Business Management; Higher Economics; Advanced Higher Accounting; Advanced Higher Business Management; Advanced Higher Economic’

As requested, our response is in the spreadsheet provided (the file ‘FOI_15-066 Appendix A’, which accompanies this letter). We hope this information meets your requirements.

These figures provide an aggregated total for the five years requested. As the number of applicants is greater than the number of students each year, and because not all applicants for each requested year will have graduated at this point, the graduate figures are significantly lower than the applicant numbers.

We would also note that the applicant cycle is different to the graduation cycle, so for example an applicant in the academic year 11/12 is unlikely to have started their studies before the academic year 12/13 and may not graduate until this summer (if on an undergraduate course).

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You have the right of appeal against this response. If you wish to appeal, please set out in writing your reasons for appealing and send to the above address. You must appeal within 60 calendar days of the date of this letter. Any appeal received after that date will not be considered nor acknowledged. This policy has been reviewed and approved by the Information Commissioner's Office.
