Andrew Cowan was born in Corby, Northamptonshire, in 1960 and educated at Beanfield Comprehensive and the University of East Anglia (UEA). He is the Director of the Creative Writing programme at UEA from which he graduated in 1985.

His first novel, *Pig* (1994), won a Betty Trask Award, the Sunday Times Young Writer of the Year Award, the Authors' Club First Novel Award, a Scottish Arts Council Book Award, the Ruth Hadden Memorial Award, and was shortlisted for five other literary awards. *Common Ground* (1996) and *Crustaceans* (2000) both received Arts Council bursaries. *What I Know* was the recipient of an Arts Council Writers' Award and was published in 2005. His creative writing guidebook, *The Art of Writing Fiction*, was published in 2011. His fifth novel, *Worthless Men*, was published in 2013.

Previously a long-standing tutor for the Arvon Foundation, he was for three years the Royal Literary Fund Writing Fellow at UEA. He was appointed to the faculty in 2004 and currently teaches and lectures at undergraduate and MA level, and supervises a number of PhD students. In 2011 he wrote UEA's successful submission to the 'Diamond Jubilee' Round of the Queen's Anniversary Prizes for Higher and Further Education, and was promoted to a Chair in 2012.

WHAT I KNOW - DRAFT 1

The footer is variously '4th – draft' or '4th' or the chapter number and sometimes title. Drafts were written circa June 2001 and December 2003. (Black ring-binder).

WHAT I KNOW - DRAFT 2 and PREP

Typescript of chapters 16-20; chapter plans; flowchart of questions and thoughts relating to the plot; notes on the backdrop and plot; table showing the breakdown of the 26 chapters and their contents; 'jottings' on individual chapters; email correspondence between Steve of Tracker Investigation Services and Andrew on the plausibility and accuracy of some of the investigative activities of the main character; examples of solicitors' forms and notices; background information on private investigators, surveillance technology and divorce proceedings. Some of the subjects covered: home front, war, glossary of war terms, Zeppelin, pardons given to soldiers for WWI military offences (BBC article), sex and contraception, women and abortion in Victorian England, eugenics, 'toffs', Carrow House in Norwich, poor law and workhouses, shops and chemists in the early part of the 20th century, clothing and Edwardian dress, animals and animal markets, transport, carriages and wheelwrights, barbed wire and wire netting, factories and ironworks in Norwich. Pages are marked up in the footer as draft 01, 02, 03, 04, new notes, etc. These numbers relate to the chapter numbers, not draft versions. Some footers have a page number followed by 'Andrew Cowan'. HARD UP STREET BY AGNES DAVEY, 1996-1998

In 1997 The Larks Press published a book based on an oral history interview of Agnes Davey. This was *Hard Up Street: growing up in King Street, Norwich, 1914-1947*. The foreword is by Cowan. Included in the file is the transcript of the taped interview of Davey. There are a number of early rejection letters from 1996.

A letter from Norfolk and Norwich Temporary Central Library confirms that their transcripts of the recordings were destroyed in the [Library's] fire but that the recordings survived (letter, 13/1/98). (Plastic sleeve).

THE ART OF WRITING FICTION, 2005-2011

2005 correspondence by Cowan in which he reluctantly has to put the editing of an anthology [Class Work] aside as his workload at UEA is too great and his priority was to start writing a new novel.

Report/review on book proposal for *The Art of Writing Fiction* (2011); correspondence with editors; copyright and permissions queries; press release; review list/press release list. (Plastic sleeve).

JENNIFER KAVANAGH (LITERARY AGENT) CORRESPONDENCE, 1993-1997

Correspondence largely relates to *Pig* and *Common Ground*; some mention of royalties and sales; includes summaries by Cowan of emails and phone calls; a letter dated 26/9/97 from Kavanagh tells of her decision for a career change. MBA would take over from her. (Plastic sleeve).

MBA LITERARY AGENTS' CORRESPONDENCE, 1996-2012

This agency took over from Jennifer Kavanagh when she changed career and closed her agency. Includes Cowan's summaries of emails and phone calls; letters; correspondence concerning *Crustaceans*. (Plastic sleeve).

SCEPTRE CORRESPONDENCE, 1997-2005

Includes letters and Cowan's summaries of emails and phone calls; a marketing plan; jackets. Relates to *Crustaceans* and *What I Know*. (Plastic sleeve).

ARTICLES, 1986-2015

Correspondence concerning articles to be written by Cowan.

Some correspondents include The Writer's Voice; Penguin; The Guardian; Waterstones (re the stocking of *Pig*); Men's Health; Weber, Hodel, Schmid; Nicholas Royle; UEA colleagues; Camilla Nelson at the University of Notre Dame, Australia (re an article by Cowan on history and fiction).

Includes letters from publishers and other writers in response to Cowan's piece in *The Author* entitled '*Too Busy, Too Full, Never Heard of You*' concerning rejections (1996).

Correspondence relating to a Northamptonshire community project 'On Location' in which writers' observe or participate in a local arts project as inspiration for a short piece of writing (2000).

Cowan contributes a 100 word blurb on self-characterisation. He cites the self-contemplation of Duc De La Rochefoucault in which the Duc focuses on how he sees himself but also on how he wishes the readers to see him. This tension and dual focus is what EM Foster recognised as being responsible for the creation of a 'round' rather than a 'flat' character. (Piece submitted to Philp Terry, University of Essex, 2006).

Correspondence between Cowan and Stephen Benson considering the co-authoring of an essay about fiction and voice, plus Benson's 'academic spoiling tactics'. Terms like 'iambic pentameter', 'dactyls' and 'trochees' are thrown into the discussion (2006).

Outline for the book *On Writing a First Novel* (working title) and Cowan's copy-edited chapter for *Writing a First Novel: reflections on the journey* edited by Karen Stevens (2014), together with correspondence with Stevens, University of Chichester (2010-2013).

Contributions to a collection of essays *The Discipline of English*. Cowan's essay is entitled 'The rise of creative writing and how it relates to the wider discipline of English'. Correspondence is with Philip Seargeant, Open University (2013-2014).

SHORT STORIES CORRESPONDENCE, 1985-2014
