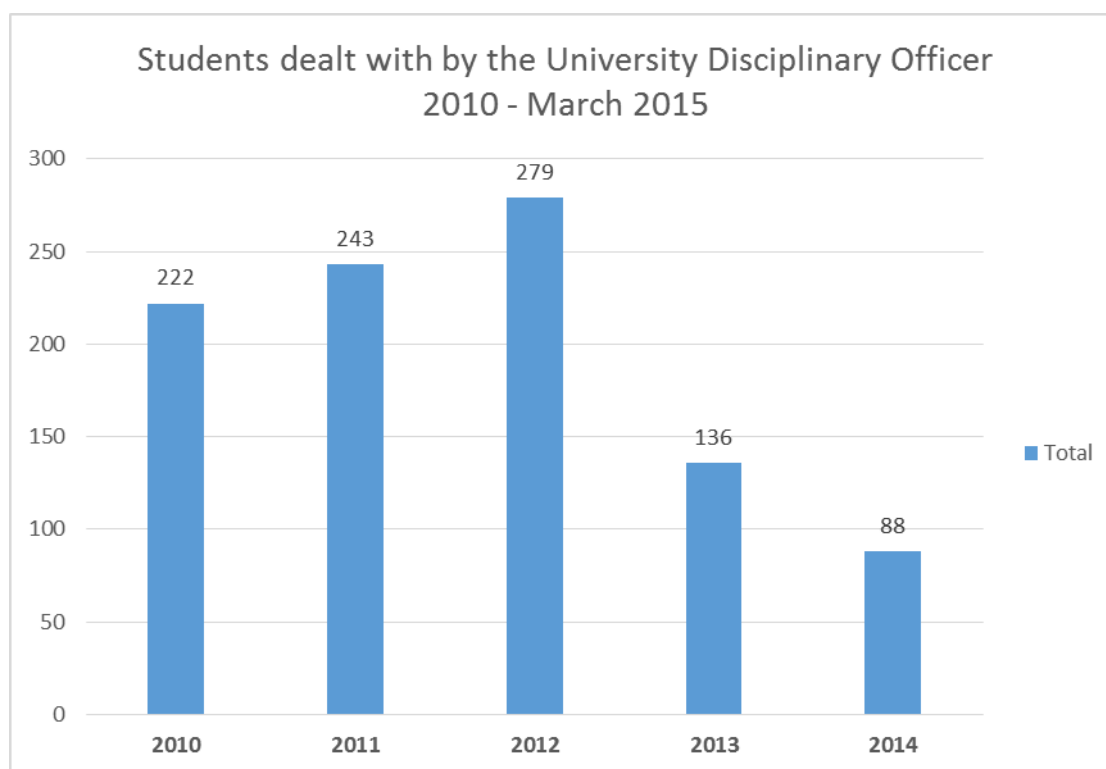


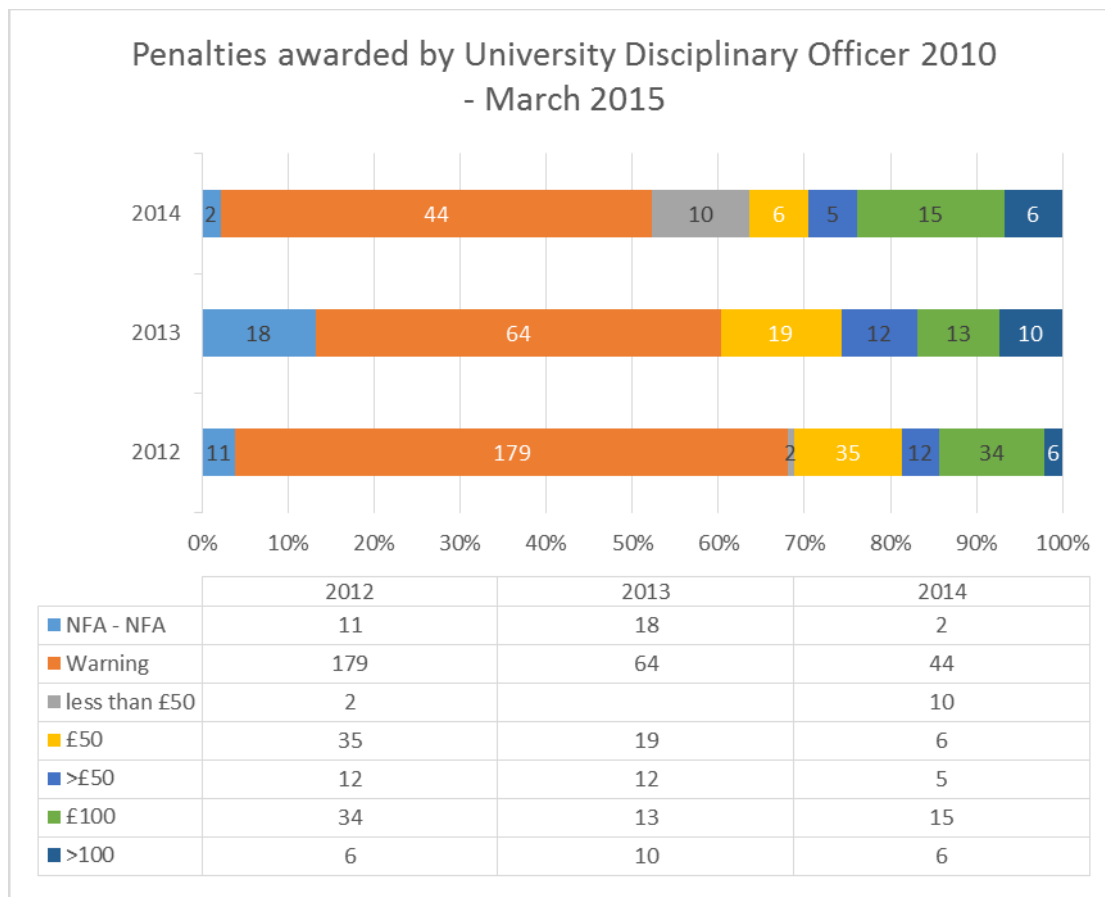

Comment: Approximately 40% of cases are ordinarily dealt with in the first Semester therefore the end of year projection is similar to last year, continuing the decrease from 2012. The greatest difference is seen in the reduction of cases relating

to Anti-Social Behaviour and Noise Disturbance. Most referrals under this category are of repeat offenders, which suggests that students are taking heed of warnings given by Senior Residents and Security Officers. There has been a significant increase in the number of students dealt with for violations of Fire Regulations and the end of year figure is likely to be higher than 2012. This is probably due to more robust reporting procedures of cleaning staff and increased vigilance from SRs and Security.



Comment: The table shows absolute figures; the graph displays them as a percentage. Overall we see an increase in the proportion of students dealt with by the Disciplinary Officer receiving fines.
